PROPOSAL

NRC organize a National Zero Waste Conference for Zero Waste communities and Zero Waste businesses. This will build on the success of the U.S. Zero Waste Business Council National Zero Waste Business Conference and the Zero Waste USA National Zero Waste Conferences.

GOALS

- 1. Attract 300-350 people from around the U.S.
- 2. Provide latest information on Zero Waste communities and Zero Waste businesses.
- 3. Develop NRC's capacity to organize national conferences.

APPROACHES

2 organizational approaches that could be taken:

- NRC Presents NRC could invite Zero Waste USA and U.S. Green Building Council to participate in a National Zero Waste Conference to be presented by NRC. Recommended by Conference Committee Co-Chairs.
- 2. NRC as Contractor NRC could contract with Zero Waste USA for NRC to organize Conference for Zero Waste USA. Zero Waste USA could invite U.S. Green Building Council to be a promotional partner. NRC would be in background like Informa for Waste Expo and Greenbuild, if it doesn't want to be too far in front of its ROs on Zero Waste.

2 styles of conference:

- All sessions in one room, with table-top exhibits around room (could hold in free or low-cost space at university like SMM Summit, City Hall, State or Federal or corporate buildings).
- Combination of plenaries and breakout sessions (more speakers, fewer places to hold, more financial risk). Recommended by Conference Committee Co-Chairs.
